#### New Beginnings: The Flowering Cross

Beginning after the Good Friday service, you are invited to bring flowers or greenery from your home to "flower" the crosses in our Green Lot on the corner of Augusta Street and West Augusta Place and on the lawn by the bell tower.

We believe the Flowering Cross can act as a reminder of the power of our faith and our collective witness. The cross at full bloom proclaims Christianity's most profound truth: that God creates hope where there was none, life from death, an empty tomb from a Roman Cross. In flowering the cross we are reminded that there is no Easter celebration without first confronting Good Friday, no empty tomb without the shadow of the cross. And, most importantly, we are reminded that death, exile, and darkness never have the final word.

The flowering cross appears in Christian art as early as the 6th century and is believed to have come from a legend that Christ's cross burst into bloom after Jesus' death.

#### From the Pews, Katherine Gettus

"...he saw and believed; for as yet they did not understand the scripture, that he must rise from the dead.' John 20:9

John 20:1-18 is the cornerstone of our Christian faith. The verses detail the resurrection as experienced through three people who were quite close to Jesus: Peter, John, and Mary Magdalene. It is hard to imagine the torment they had endured in the preceding few days. From the high moments of Palm Sunday, to observing Jesus betrayed by their close friend, seeing him tried and sentenced, beaten and humiliated, killed on the cross, then Peter denying Jesus three times. They thought Jesus was here to save the world, and yet Jesus had been killed. I imagine these three people were feeling raw and exhausted after the agony of the last few days.

With that as the emotional setting, let's take a moment to picture the events described in John 20. Mary is at the tomb, seeing the stone had been rolled away. She is worried that Jesus' body has been moved rather than realizing that this is the climax of the story – the outcome of the resurrection. I picture John and Peter running to the tomb. When they arrive at the tomb, they see the linen wrappings lying there. Then the scripture says something so interesting in verse 9 – "for as yet they did not understand the scripture, that he must rise from the dead." The fact that Jesus died and rose again is the crux of our faith, and these close friends of Jesus didn't yet get it. Peter, John, and Mary were literally standing in the Easter Story and even as they began to "believe," they still didn't understand.

As believers in 2023, our Easter experience has always been framed around the hope of the resurrection because we have the benefit of hindsight. As a child, I imagined the days between Jesus' death and Easter Sunday as a time when his friends sat in hope, expecting for Jesus to show back up as promised. This is yet another thing I have pictured far too simply. Back during the first Easter, these close friends of Jesus are seeing the evidence of his resurrection, and they are only just beginning to comprehend the meaning. Here we are over 2000 years later, and while we know of the resurrection, I would suggest that we too are just

in the infancy of understanding.

I've written previously about the experience of losing my dad in November.

His last few weeks were exhausting and so hard for my family. Despite the turmoil going on in his physical body, I was blown away by the peace and calm my dad had – he expressed feeling very close to God. I can only imagine that God was starting to open my dad's eyes in a way I haven't experienced. Because of Easter, we have hope. Since the beginning of time, our world has been full of both beauty and brokenness. There is war, hardship, loss of loved ones, school shootings, destructive tornadoes – juxtaposed against joyful moments as babies are born, and beautiful spring flowers are blooming. As humans and Christians, we try to understand – but the truth is that we can't. We are like John, Peter, and Mary who believed but didn't yet understand. We are a part of the story, with the hope of Easter, but have just scratched the surface of understanding the magnitude of the story. Our God has so much left to reveal. This Easter, I have the hope of the recurrection, the averages that there is much left to know have the hope of the resurrection, the awareness that there is much left to know, and what is left is likely better than I can imagine. We believe, but we don't yet understand...and even that statement is brimming with hope.
