But Jesus does not intend for us to lock ourselves away from the world. Indeed, Jesus said, "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you." We need to bring Jesus with us outside the confines of our homes and out into the world-whether it be through forgiveness; caring for the sick, alone, poor, those in prison; sharing the Good News; bringing calm to a turbulent situation; or just catching up with a friend. While I highly recommend spending quiet time alone with Jesus, let us

break out of our comfort zones and bring that peace with us into the world. The same power that allowed Jesus to conquer death can bring peace – ever so incrementally – to our daily challenges. The peace does not have to fade as we leave the quiet room.

I have a morning ritual of waking up incredibly early. I walk in zombie-like fashion to the kitchen and prepare a cup of coffee. I slog up to our attic space. I light a candle and I enjoy the calm before the storm of the day. Sometimes God blesses me with the soothing sound of rain pattering on the roof. This is my time

Although my thoughts typically drift into the issues of the day and what I might have to deal with at work or at home, for a brief moment I can sometimes find peace and wholeness. Inevitably, the moment will end, I will pry myself up out of the chair, and I will begin the other morning rituals-showering, eating breakfast, catching up on my emails, and heading off for another day. The peace

As we bask in the glory of the resurrection, I note that Jesus' first words after appearing to his disciples in John's Gospel were "Peace be with you!" This may be a traditional Jewish greeting, but here it is much more profound. Jesus' presence is peace with you.

Of course, it may be easier for peace to find you in a quiet room, away from the noise of the world. Indeed, searching for peace in the noise of the world is difficult as exemplified by Thomas. Thomas did not have the blessing of being with Jesus when Jesus appeared to his disciples in that locked room. The doubts of the world crept in and led to his natural skepticism. Reassuringly, Thomas did eventually see the signs and found "My lord and my God!"
