From the Pews, Amanda Brinkley

An excerpt from today's reading John 21:1-19

Afterward Jesus appeared again to his disciples, by the Sea of Galilee. It happened this way: Simon Peter, Thomas, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two other disciples were together. "I'm going out to fish," Simon Peter told them, and they said, "We'll go with you." So they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. Early in the morning, Jesus stood on the shore, but the disciples did not realize that it was Jesus. He called out to them, "Friends, haven't you any fish?" "No," they answered. He said, "Throw your net on the right side of the boat and you will find some." When they did, they were unable to haul the net in because of the large number of fish. Then the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord!" As soon as Simon Peter heard him say, "It is the Lord," he wrapped his outer garment around him (for he had taken it off) and jumped into the water. The other disciples followed in the boat, towing the net full of fish, for they were not far from shore, about a hundred yards. When they landed, they saw a fire of burning coals there with fish on it, and some bread. Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish you have just caught." So Simon Peter climbed back into the boat and dragged the net ashore. It was full of large fish, 153, but even with so many the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast." None of the disciples dared ask him, "Who are you?" They knew it was the Lord. Jesus came, took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish. This was now the third time Jesus appeared to his disciples after he was raised from the dead.

Here we all are post-Easter: the dyed eggs have been tossed, the flowered cross has been taken down, the seersucker and pastel dresses have been tucked away in the back of our closets. We came to church, we brunchted with family, and we were (and are) truly thankful for the resurrection and that we are forever saved by His grace.

But this scripture makes me wonder—what is your Easter story? We all know the stone was rolled away, the tomb was empty, and the acclamation "He is Risen!" But today's scripture in John reminds us that Easter should be lived and not just believed. We should actively participate in Easter in our daily lives, and our lives should be different today than they were pre-Easter.

Most of the seven disciples in this story had seen Jesus twice now since his resurrection. They were professional fishermen and had fished in this area probably thousands of times. They showed up that morning to waters they knew, a familiar boat, and their same old lives. And they caught nothing. But then Jesus came to them and said: "Cast the net to the right side of the boat." As if to say keep fishing-- but do it differently. Keep living your life, but Easter has come, and Easter is lived-- so live differently. It may not sound like much, moving the net from the left side of the boat to the right. But they went from catching no fish to full nets when they followed the guidance of the resurrected Christ and altered their normal routine.

Kate Bowler reminds us in her blessing for change: "Blessed are you dear one, when the world around you has changed. Everything is different now... Things have changed. And it would be silly to imagine you haven't been altered along with them...Blessed are you who aren't pretending things are the same... Blessed are you the changed." In what parts of your life could you make a small change, and have a full net?
