## John 20:19-23

Our gospel lesson takes place on Sunday evening after Jesus has been crucified. He has risen, but he has not yet appeared to the disciples. The disciples are in a room with the doors locked. They are in great fear of the Roman authorities and of the Jewish leaders, who are threatening them. They are fearful for their lives, their families, and their future. Jesus comes and stands among them and says, "Peace be with you." He shows them his scarred hands and his side. They are overjoyed when they see the Lord,

Again, Jesus says, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, I am sending you." And with that he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit."

As the pastor, Diaz-Pabon, writes, "...the Holy Spirit - He comforts us, helps us, guides us, comes alongside us, counsels us, and intercedes and advocates for us. There is no area in life in which the believer does not need the help of the Holy Spirit."
