From the Pews, Christa Likes

Jonah 1: 1-17

When I read this passage, I immediately think of one of my favorite childhood Disney movies, Pinocchio. I vividly remember the scene where Pinocchio and Geppetto are trapped inside Monstro, the whale. My favorite scene was when Pinocchio and his father build a fire, causing the whale to sneeze. This allows them to escape the whale and start their lives over together. So why did Jonah end up in the belly of the "large fish" just like Pinocchio did? And what does this mean for us today?

In the book of Jonah, Jonah is commanded by God to go to the city of Nineveh to preach to the people there. The Ninevites were part of the Assyrian Empire and were leading lives filled with wickedness, cruelty, and sin. They were known to skin their enemies, gouge out the eyes or cut off the ears of defeated soldiers to make their lives miserable. Maybe worst of all, they were known to kill children in the cities they conquered. In other words, Jonah didn't want to go to Nineveh, for which he had good reason.

Was Jonah running away because he feared the people of Nineveh? That seemed to be my initial thought. However, when I looked a little closer, maybe Jonah didn't want to go because he knew that God would show these people his amazing grace? Maybe he was scared to death that these awful people, who deserve death and punishment, would get a reprieve?

Do we relate to this in any way? It is such an uncomfortable subject to think about. We like to think that we, as loving and forgiving Christians, are supportive of EVERYONE receiving God's grace. We seem to be comfortable with the idea that everyone needs Jesus but do we fully support the idea that everyone needs or deserves God's grace?

The truth is, God is not likely calling us to enter a foreign country to preach to evil people, but he might be calling us to love the unlovable. It is hard to admit this to ourselves. Is it possible that we really are less "grace-filled" than we think? Maybe today we stop and ask God for forgiveness and the ability to love those who are hard for us to love. Miracles can happen, can't they?
