From the Pews, Parks Workman

Jonah 2:1-10

Have you ever been swallowed by a fish? Let's put aside the thoughts of Jonah and the whale that we perhaps learned as children and really contemplate Jonah's story. Have you ever been swallowed by a fish?

Consider a time when the storms of life were raging, and you felt distant and isolated from God. Perhaps you were angry at God and were running away. Do you remember those storms? Are they raging right now? Jonah's prayer can offer us a glimpse:

You cast me into the deep, into the heart of the seas, and the flood surrounded me; all your waves and billows passed over me.

The waters closed in over me; the deep surrounded me; weeds were wrapped around my head; at the root of the mountains.

Unfortunately, the storms of the world touch us all. We may seek comfort in the wrong places, burdened by guilt and shame from our decisions. God may seem a distant and futile hope. In the midst of the storms of my life, there have been times where I can relate to Jonah: "I am driven away from your sight; how shall I look again upon your holy temple?"

But Jonah's story can bring us comfort. Though Jonah's disobedience led to the depths, the belly of the fish may have provided a shield from the storms, allowing him time for reflection and for turning back to God. Similarly, the depths of our own struggles can offer us an opportunity for perspective, leading us to the true source of life in Jesus.

Read Jonah's prayer in Jonah 2:1-10. There is great comfort in the words: "I called to the LORD out of my distress, and he answered me; out of the belly of Sheol I cried, and you heard my voice."

If you are currently swallowed by a fish, remember it's not the end of your story. Jesus spent time in the belly of the fish, even unto death. Yet Jesus conquered death.

Use the experience to deepen your faith and draw closer to God. Seek comfort through prayer. Reach out to members of our church community for support. Things may not turn out as you expect or desire. It might not even be pleasant—you may be "vomited back to dry land." But trust that God's unfailing love will deliver you from the depths.
