

From the Pews, Elaine Smith

Jonah 3:1-10

Can you think of a time as a child when you were asked more than once to complete a task? Then, you went about it half-heartedly with a bad attitude? Well, that would be God's experience with his prophet, Jonah. Even after delivering Jonah from the belly of a whale, God had to ask him a second time to deliver a message to Nineveh. Jonah did not want God to show mercy to evil people. To say that Jonah delivered the message in a lackluster manner would be an understatement. As Ben preached at the beginning of this series, Jonah mumbled the scary message, "Nineveh will be destroyed in forty days." Even so, the people of Nineveh LISTENED and paid penance for their evil ways. They sat in sackcloth and ashes as a symbol of sincere repentance.

God responded by forgiving them, showing compassion and mercy. Is that fair? Jonah did not think so. He did not want God to show evil people mercy.

It may be human nature to compare sins and feel better than others deeming them undeserving. But here is a central and difficult question. What did we do to earn God's compassion and mercy?

Sit with this thought for a while. As a Christian, we should want God's mercy for others. Let's all remember this lesson the next time we are feeling holier than thou. It is easier to judge and feel self-righteous than to demonstrate compassion for others. Challenge yourself to not leave your compassion at the door as
