From the Pews, Gaye Sprague

Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" And I said, "Here I am, send me!"

Isaiah 6:8 (NRSV)

This is one of my favorite Bible verses. First, there's the poetic ring of "Whom shall I send..." In this context, God may have been asking this question of the heavenly beings surrounding him, but it also feels as though he's asking and inspiring **us.** Then I love that God asks "...who will go for **us**?" Once again, the question may have been addressed to heavenly beings, but it feels as though he's asking **us**. Us, yes, us. Right here, right now.

Then there's Isaiah's well-known reply, "Here am I; send me!" Don't you love the exclamation mark the New Revised Standard Version uses?! Isaiah responded immediately and emphatically. He didn't check his calendar. He didn't think about the financial costs. He simply responded, "...send me!"

Now, we are not all full-time prophets, and we have very real responsibilities and practical limitations. But in a connecting, serving, and growing church like ours there are many opportunities for service requiring all sorts of time commitments and talents. Let's listen for God saying to us, "Whom shall I send...". Give Julia Watkins a call (before she heads to Davidson after July 16) to find ways to serve that really do accommodate your particular responsibilities and limitations.

When you find that just right way to contribute, you'll find what so many of our fellow Westminster members have found: you really do receive more than you give.
