### From the Pews, Mary Frances Knapp

### Fear. Guilt. Worry. Just me?

I am a planner by nature. I thrive on predictability, routine, and consistency. It feels safe to me. Most times I think if I can just prepare for what might come, I'll be ahead of the game. When things don't go according to plan (and let's be honest-that's how it usually goes), it's easy to let your mind go to a worst case scenario. Could I have changed this outcome? What if I had done something differently? If we can't control the little things, how can we ever control the big things? The reality is that we can't. Fear and worry are inevitable in our daily

What does God teach us about handling our fears of the unknown?

When we hear the story of Jacob's return to his homeland, he is wrestling with his own fears and guilt. Jacob had wronged his brother, Esau, and he knew it. In anticipation of his return, Jacob sends a message to Esau, humbling himself to his brother in an attempt to gain back his favor. In response, Jacob hears that Esau has gathered 400 men to meet him upon arrival. Fearing the worst, Jacob splits his camp into two. It is a pragmatic and logical move. If one camp is attacked, the other half will have a chance to survive. Jacob then prays to God. God had told him to return to his homeland and that he would protect him. God tells Jacob he has prepared him for this, and that he will take care of him and his family. Jacob, trusting his faith in God, then abandons his logical, "safe" plan. God has told Jacob that he will protect him, despite his previous sins. Jacob places his worry and fear aside and puts his complete trust in God, accepting God's promise to him.

We are imperfect people. No amount of planning or scheduling will ever really give us any control over what happens in our day to day lives. And the good news is that's ok. Our fears and worries can even be a good thing! They lead us to prayer and faith in God and his promise to us. God tells us that in spite of our own sins and worries, he is here to protect us. He is perfect in his preparation of us and of what is to come.

And that just may be the best plan of them all.
