From the Pews. Laurie Koch

Sometimes in life there are times that we feel called to do something, but it feels overwhelming. Big ideas or big projects can make us feel like we are inadequate or underprepared and don't know where to start.

I imagine this is what the disciples were feeling the evening described in this week's passage, when they were unexpectedly tasked with feeding thousands of people. Jesus commanded them to give him the meager portions of food that they had so he could bless it, and miraculously, the food multiplied to feed a multitude of people.

When I think of this story, it reminds me of some advice I've heard when embarking on something big - "use what you have, and start where you are." It's rare that any of us are perfectly prepared for each scenario thrown at us in life, but we have to start somewhere. God has given us what we need to accomplish what he has put on our hearts, even if it may not feel that way. When we offer Jesus what we have, and He blesses it, He can magnify what we offer to accomplish His purposes.

Several years ago, a dear friend of mine felt called to do something big. Her idea was simple - she wanted to take gently used baby clothing and gift it to mothers who needed it. She wasn't sure how this exactly would happen, but she shared her idea with friends, and asked them to come to her home one night to officially launch the project.

That first night, her friends came with their own children's outgrown baby clothes and by the end of the evening gifts for these mothers poured out of her living room. Five years later, her idea has turned into a thriving organization that has provided clothing and comfort to hundreds of mothers and babies in our community. It is incredible to see how God has used what she offered - initially just a small pile of her children's clothing and the willingness to help - to bless the recipients of these gifts as well as those who volunteer.

My friend would tell you that when she started, she wasn't sure if her idea would work. But she took what she had, asked for God's blessing, and watched in amazement as the blessings multiplied. I pray that we all have the courage and faith to act on the opportunities that we see to help in our community, and with God's guidance and blessings, that they flourish beyond what we ever thought possible.
