Today's passage, Mark 1:16-20, reminds me of the many difficult decisions that we face in our lives. What was such a simple, on-the-spot decision for the fishermen Simon, Andrew, James, and John to drop everything they were doing and follow Jesus. They gave up their livelihoods in order to follow a man in whom they believed! Where would they live? What and how would they eat? How would their families survive in their absences? So many questions, yet they chose to follow Jesus seemingly without even a second thought.

So now we fast forward 2,000+ years to you and me today. If faced with a similar decision, how many of us would choose to give up everything we have in order to follow Jesus? 
