From the Pews, Elaine Smith

Romans 5:1-5

Verse five reads "Hope does not disappoint us because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us." I love to visualize God pouring his love into us. I hate to admit that I felt God's presence more often as a child than I have as an adult. At the ripe old age of 71, I hope to change that. There's that word hope. Hope is often the feeling of waiting for something to come. But God promises his presence

We do not need to wait. He is with us in our joys and our sorrows. Hope can encourage us no matter what we face.

Anne Lamott encourages us to put on the good glasses. She writes: "I can walk around with these glasses. These bad glasses of judgment and seeing everything that really is not working for me, everything that is either annoying or infuriating, or I can put on the good glasses and I can see God's hand everywhere I look."

Brother Lawrence was a seventeenth century monk in France. After many hardships, he was assigned to kitchen duty in the monastery where he prepared and cooked the food for the day. He cleaned up afterwards. He began to infuse his relationship with God into his menial tasks and to have an ongoing conversation with God as he went about his chores.

Here is an excerpt from Practicing His Presence, a compilation of Brother Lawrence's letters that was published after his death in 1691. "If you and I are going to enjoy the peace of paradise in this life we must become accustomed to a familiar, humble and very affectionate conversation with the Lord Jesus. You must stop your spirit from wandering from the Lord no matter what the
