From the Pews, Mike Peters

The passage for today in Luke comes after what Matthew calls the Sermon on the Mount. Although Luke does not refer to it as such. Jesus descends from the high ground to the town of Capernaum on the Sea of Galilee. A servant of a soldier in the town is sick and about to die. While he is referred to as a Centurian, an officer in command of about 100 men, it is not clear whether he is a Roman or a member of Herod Antipas's forces. In either case, he is a Gentile and someone who is used to being in control and having his orders carried out and desires satisfied. However, he has no power over the fate of his ill servant. He is not in control. In desperation he dispatches a group of Jewish elders to appeal to Jesus to heal his servant. They seem to go willingly, because the Centurian had acted benevolently with the Jews in the past. As Jesus approaches the house, the Centurian through friends begs Jesus not to come into the house, but just "say the word and my servant will be healed." According to rabbinical law, a Jew ceremonially defiles himself by entering a Gentile's home. Jesus is amazed by the Centurian's faith, and He heals the servant.

This story has resonance with many of us I imagine. We are constantly seeking to control every aspect of our lives. If we are in positions of authority whether at home, at work or in the broader society - with children, spouses or colleagues - we expect our wishes to be fulfilled. And in many cases, we have the power to ensure that they are. We may think we don't need God's help. It is only when things appear desperate, a dramatic change in our circumstances for instance, that we realize we are not in control. We need help and the help that can only come from God. When those times come, do we have the faith of the Centurian? Are we confident in turning to God through Christ? Have we recognized that even when we thought we were "in control," Christ was with us? Have we acknowledged that we need God's love, care and help constantly in our lives and not just when we are facing a crisis?
