# From the Pews, Stephen & Mary Ridgeway

"A poor widow came and put in two small copper coins, which are worth a penny." "He said to them "truly I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all those who are contributing to the treasury. For all of them have contributed out of their abundance; but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had..." Mark 12:42-43

It's likely that everyone can look back and remember a small gesture from a mentor, friend, or stranger that had an outsized impact. A few encouraging words, a quick visit, or a hastily jotted note can be the thing that keeps someone going. Most of us can remember that teacher who spent a little extra time, a coach who continued to encourage, or a nurse who lingered because they knew that going beyond would make all the difference. Little things, in other words, can become big things.

Recently, we found an anonymous handwritten note under the windshield wiper of our car pointing out a concerning bit of damage to the rear passengerside tire. A defect that at highway speeds could've resulted in a serious accident. Who knows what trouble this small act of kindness saved us? A small gesture, but, possibly a consequential one.

When we starting attending Westminster almost twenty years ago, the sense that it was a congregation of people who went beyond in ministering to each other, supporting the community, and expressing God's love was evident. The pillars of hospitality, generosity, justice, imagination, and joy are still in abundance. A quick glance at the Harbinger will show this. From a comprehensive worship and Sunday School schedule, to Narcotics Anonymous, to Trick-or-Treating at the Terra Bella Retirement Home, we reach out to each other and beyond our

This verse from Mark and the contribution of the poor widow is a challenging text for Stewardship Season. Who can match her generosity? This can be seen, though, as an act of faith on her part. She made the donation of little, believing that with God's will, it could become something greater. Who but Jesus could imagine that we'd find power and inspiration in her example 2000 years later?

We give to Westminster because we believe that it is the best way to go beyond ourselves. That, with the love of God expressed in this congregation and what we give, will be magnified beyond our imagination. It's hard to imagine a better stewardship of our gifts.
