

"THE LIGHT OF THE REVELATION TO THE GENTILES"

In this week's scripture, Luke 2:22-40, this phrase is highlighted. What does it mean? Two thousand years ago a devout old man, Simeon, waited and waited to see the Christ. The Holy Spirit had promised him that he would not see death until he had witnessed the Lord's Christ. Imagine his surprise-his joy, his elation-when that moment arrived!

But then came his prophecy-that the Child was appointed for the rise and for the fall of many in Israel. What were Mary and Joseph to think? How could they possibly comprehend what lay ahead for them? And for the nation of Israel. And for all of mankind, for that matter.

What followed has forever changed the world. With Christ's teaching and following the word rapidly spread throughout the region. People flocked to hear Him. Beginning with the poor and the disenfranchised, Christ's message reached more and more people and socioeconomic groups. Whether religious, non-religious, Jew, Gentile, Roman or simply an illiterate peasant-they rushed to see Him, to touch Him and to hear Him. His parables both fascinated and perplexed many. He created a greater hunger and thirst for the word of God.

He transformed the world. After His death and after his appearance to so many following His resurrection ... and after Paul's conversion on the road to Damascus, word spread even more rapidly. Paul's many letters written from prison survive to this day and form the bulk of the New Testament.

We have such a rich legacy and heritage from our Savior and from the many who have propagated His Word throughout the centuries.
