
From the Pews, Rosemary Hughes

We continue in our "The Fabric of Faith" sermon series today, and this morning's focus is "Faith as Seeing." In Hebrews 11:1, we read, "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." It is this idea of true "sight" manifesting itself in what is not actually visible that intrigues me. Dictionary definitions of the word "sight" range from the physical (perception of objects by use of the eyes) to the intellectual (mental perception or regard) to the emotional (something unusual, surprising, shocking, or distressing), but when we consider the meaning of the word "see," we encounter more figurative language (to penetrate to the true nature of; comprehend; detect; to stay with to the end or until completion; persevere). It is likely fair to say that everyone desires to "be seen," to be valued and affirmed, but so often we struggle with finding that "conviction of things not seen." God sees us, with all of our wrinkles and warts, but we are prone to doubt (like Thomas) what we cannot see with our physical eyes. Growing in our faith is taking a journey into the unknown, into places where we cannot see what lies ahead, but even in those uncertain times, God knows exactly where we are and what directions we need to find our way. Perhaps the truest test of faith is to discard our ideas of sight and allow God to be our GPS.




