First used liturgically in the 5th c.1, the Kyrie (Greek: Kyrie eleison ~ Lord, have mercy) was employed by both Martin Luther and John Calvin as an act of contrition.<sup>2</sup> Our hymnal. Glory to God, contains six settings of the Kyrie. We will sing the setting that employs the familiar American folk melody LAND OF REST.

It's rocking gently as the short waves on the Sea of Galilee lap the shore. I almost picture the cloud of dust that the cartoon Roadrunner leaves behind when he makes a quick exit to get away from Coyote.

What amazing faith and courage the disciples showed when, according to Luke, they "left everything" to follow Jesus. While there are modern day spiritual leaders who immediately leave everything to follow Jesus, most that I know have dedicated a life of education and often sacrifice to listening to and following God's call. Our pastors, missionaries, those who work in human service nonprofits that are not able to pay market rate salaries, our church staff, and even unpaid volunteers have heard a call and followed. We admire, appreciate, and pray for them.

But let's don't forget the Zebedees in the lives of these faithful souls. Spouses, children, parents, friends, or even former business partners who have to move, change long-term plans, give moral support, keep a flexible schedule, or myriad other actions required of the ones directly connected to those called. When we think about the courageous ones answering a call let's admire, appreciate, and pray for the Zebedees too. They are having to mend a few extra nets.
