NEW BEGINNINGS: THE FLOWERING CROSS

Beginning after the Good Friday service, you are invited to bring flowers or greenery from your home to "flower" the cross on the lawn by the bell tower.

We believe the flowering cross can act as a reminder of the power of our faith and our collective witness. The cross at full bloom proclaims Christianity's most profound truth: that God creates hope where there was none, life from death, an empty tomb from a Roman cross. In flowering the cross we are reminded that there is no Easter celebration without first confronting Good Friday, no empty tomb without the shadow of the cross. And, most importantly, we are reminded that death, exile, and darkness never have the final word.

The flowering cross appears in Christian art as early as the 6th century and is believed to have come from a legend that Christ's cross burst into bloom after Jesus' death.

From the Pews, Joey Fievet

Our scripture reading for this week, Mark 16:1-8, concludes the Gospel of Mark and leaves us with a most perplexing question. What now? In closing his gospel in this manner, Mark shows us his genius. Rather than taking us through the various sightings and interactions with his disciples and his crucifixion, Mark leaves us to wonder what happened next. Why the empty tomb? Why the heavenly messenger inside the tomb? We are filled with questions, astonishment, bewilderment, and hope.

What does happen next? What are we to do? Mark stimulates us to continue our journey - and thereby deepen and solidify our faith. So many questions...

To help us find those answers I recommend Amy-Jill Levine's book, The Gospel of Mark. As a professor of New Testament and Jewish studies at Vanderbilt University, she presents a uniquely stimulating view of Mark's gospel. She juxtaposes moral, life-threatening issues of Biblical times with dilemmas we are facing today. Again, so many questions.

What does it mean to be a Christian? Do we show it in our everyday lives? Do we merely come to services on Sunday - or do we volunteer in distributing food, in working with Habitat for Humanity, in visiting shut-ins, etc? Do we reach out beyond what is comfortable to connect, to give, and to live as Christ would have us to do? Mark's conclusion in Chapter 16 leaves us open to all these

And finally, the stone was rolled away from the tomb - signifying that God removed the barrier to free us from death. Jesus is alive! The resurrection is our hope for things to come. It is time to rejoice and spread God's word!
