From the Pews, Will Edwards

Each year, while on vacation at the beach, my wife Beth and I wake up very early at least one morning during beach week to go out and watch the sunrise. Standing on the shore as the waves ebb and flow and welcome us to the morning, the morning sky starts to lighten. Then, in an instant the sun breaks the horizon. At first the sun seems small, but its grandeur grows as it rises over the crest of the ocean. The big orange ball lights up the whole world at that moment! We take a few pictures, okay a whole bunch of pictures...but for the majority of the time we stare in awe at the beginning of a new day. A new day that God has created. As I stand there beside Beth, I silently praise God for the blessings I have in my life. I thank God, the Creator, God the Provider for all things.

In today's first scripture lesson, Psalm 104:14-24, the Psalmist praises God the Creator of all the animals of the field, and of the birds of the air. He causes grass to grow for the cattle and plants for the people to cultivate, to bring forth food from the earth. He provides trees for birds to build their nests and mountains for wild goats. God has made the darkness and the night when animals come out. He has made the moon to mark the seasons and the sun to mark the day. When the sun rises the animals lie in their dens and people go out to their work and labor until the evening.

Verse 24 sums up this passage very well: "O, Lord, how manifold are your works! In wisdom you have made them all; the earth is full of your creatures."

When I first read this scripture, I thought about creation and all that God provides. I thought about the sun rising in the morning. I also thought of the hymn, "All Things Bright and Beautiful." The refrain is what caught me:

> "All things bright and beautiful, All creatures great and small, All things wise and wonderful, The Lord God made them all."

I encourage you to take the time and watch the sun rise and let the wonder of God's creation surround you.
