From the Pews, Laurie Koch

In today's first scripture, Jesus is traveling. As he makes his way from place to place teaching and healing, he encounters crowds of people that really need help. He feels compassion for them, and says, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few." Haven't we all felt this way? Many times I have felt that what I have to get done is overwhelming for just one person to manage. I love reading passages like this in which Jesus encounters emotions and situations that I have in my daily life, because it gives me a road map of how to handle these situations in a Christian way.

When Jesus saw that there was too much work and not enough workers, he gathered his disciples - his most trusted inner circle - and gave them detailed instructions on how they could expand his mission of teaching and healing others. It seems the protocol he is showing us for leadership is to find trusted and competent helpers and empower them to act, while giving them specific instructions and guidance. Not only is Jesus showing us that we don't have to do it all ourselves, but that it is important to include others in meaningful work.

In addition, this scripture shows us that it's not enough to simply notice those around us that need help. When we see those who are overlooked and ignored, we should find ways to actively help them. Jesus is showing us that it's not the compassion itself that makes us Christians, it's the action after the emotion. If we feel called to help others in a certain way, it's likely that God is behind that pull. Let's resolve to act on those calls and help others in our lives who are called to do important work.
