From the Pews, Blake Hoffman

I feel pretty confident that, if not you personally, most of your pew mates have played Charades at least once. It is a game of description through miming, and there is no shortage of challenging words to stump the actor. Some will wrestle with conveying a place through action. Others will find a celebrity impersonation particularly challenging. If you are like me, it may be the acting itself that causes the word or phrase to seem indescribable (we are Presbyterians after all).

There is a concept, however, that would paralyze more than just the stage shy among us: glory. We each know glory when we experience what Merriam-Webster defines as "great beauty and splendor." Glory is astonishing on its own. It is even more incredible when it belongs to the Almighty.

Words or actions may begin a description of God's glory, but we can rest assured that our human vocabulary and expression are completely insufficient. It is a goodness, beauty, love, and being that is beyond all description. His glory is in the small spaces and in the large expanses. It is a reason to go hiking and a cause to stay at home. As a great comfort, glory is all around us. As we seek God, his glory is revealed to us. As we show love, we are honored to embody it.

Allow yourself to be humbled by the concept of glory. This may be frustrating to a person playing Charades, but it is the most satisfying loss for words (and actions) that you can ever experience. Seek God. Be open to his glory. Receive all that God is, and praise the Lord!
