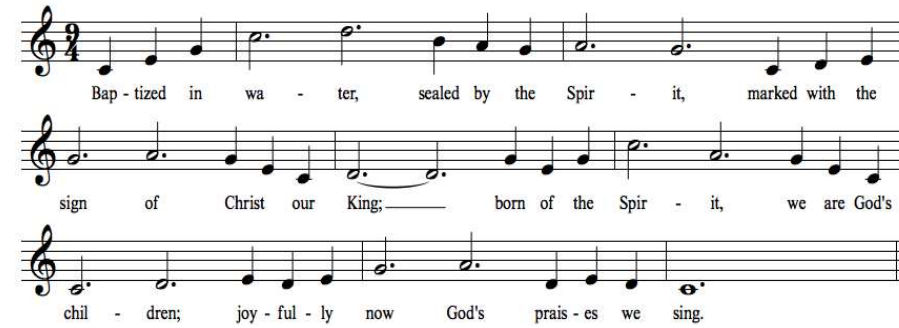

Do you ever feel that tug-of-war stretch of being pulled in two different directions? Attempting to reach beyond human ability to fill various demands of the day. We often do so at a rapid pace, where efficiency, haste, and people-pleasing reign.

When I'm caught dancing my perceived solo act, I misuse God's gifts and flounder through actions that don't glorify God.
