In Romans 11:32, "For God has consigned ALL to disobedience, that he may have mercy on ALL," truly, Paul is writing about ALL Jews and ALL Gentiles here. This verse 32 goes with verses 25-32, which is about God's promise of Israel's restoration. The latter verses, 33-36, are about Israel's restoration and the occasion for glorifying God.
