From the Pews, Gaye Sprague

"...that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting the message of reconciliation to us." 2 Corinthians 5:19 NRSV

We are so blessed at Westminster to have a music program that provides beautiful, inspirational, uplifting, and interesting music in our worship services. My own singing sounds really good in my heart and in my head, but when it comes out into the world it is off key and a little squeaky. Even though I can't contribute to musical harmony, I can recognize it and appreciate it and am grateful for it.

One way to look at "reconciliation" is as "restoring harmony." And don't we yearn for harmony these days? Political division in our country. War, death, and destruction in the Middle East and Ukraine. Environmental challenges such as wildfires and flooding. We could list many situations in which reconciliation is needed, but examples of lack of harmony don't just include national and international matters. Disharmony can be very personal and private. Strained family relations. Physical challenges. Financial stress. How can we restore harmony?

What a welcome message this week's scripture is! "In Christ, God reconciles the world to himself." If that is not amazing enough, note this part: "not counting their trespasses against them." What a gift! Not only do we have a way to restore harmony between us and God, but our past sins are not held against us. How often have our own sins contributed to disharmony?

Here is the hard part: "and entrusting the message of reconciliation (harmony) to us." We have been entrusted with bringing harmony. Harmony between ourselves and God and between ourselves and others. It is definitely not an easy assignment, but we have been given Jesus' teachings to guide us. We have the Bible, weekly sermons, Sunday School, and multiple opportunities for Bible study at Westminster, and let's not forget prayer. Just a reminder: we can't hold the past sins of others against them. We have to forgive as God has forgiven us.

I doubt that I will wake up one day with a harmonious singing voice, but I know I have been given the gift of bringing harmony in other aspects of life if I'll just claim it.

In the 16th Century Martin Luther revolutionized the Western world with his Ninety-Five Theses. Through his protests a new church movement began. Yet even then questions about how one comes to know God, how one is reconciled to God, and how one experiences God in worship were hotly contested.
