From the Pews, Parks Workman

God has blessed me richly this year, even in the face of many difficulties. As 2024 draws to a close, I am overwhelmed with gratitude for undeserved gifts—a loving family, a safe home, health, and so much more. These blessings, though they may be fragile, remind me of God's enduring goodness.

Indeed, I was fortunate enough to take my family to New York the weekend before Christmas. One evening, we decided to see the Rockettes' Christmas Spectacular. It was quite an event, and the only word to truly describe it is "spectacular." During the show, I was surprised when it shifted from a classic secular celebration of Christmas-with dozens of Santas-to the familiar story of the three magi coming to worship Jesus. It was beautiful to witness. In the midst of all the commercialism NYC has to offer, the applause for the birth and worship of Jesus at Radio City Music Hall was a fitting celebration of our King. It served as a gut check, prompting me to ask the question: in the midst of these blessings, how am I responding to Jesus?

The familiar story of the magi's visit with Jesus illustrates different responses from those with much. First, there is Herod. Herod sees Jesus as a threat to his success, wealth, and power. His response is to try to control the situation and stop Jesus—even resorting to violence. This response is the path of destruction.

Second, there is the response of the magi. The magi come and immediately fall down to worship Jesus, offering Him their gifts. They trust that their greatest wealth lies in worshiping Jesus.

As 2025 begins, we should reflect on our response to Jesus. Will we protect our secular comforts, live selfishly, and chase fleeting pleasures? Or will we trust Jesus to provide what we truly need? Will we, like the magi, offer our gifts back to him, submitting to his plans?

I know I will falter in 2025 and, at times, try to control my own path. However, I hope to grow in my trust in Jesus, offering him my gifts and following his plan. The blessings of this world may be fragile and fleeting, but the blessings of Jesus are lasting and eternal. Hopefully, in the midst of the secularism of the world, we can pause and take time to be with Jesus, basking in his grace and love.
