# From the Pews, Mike Peters

I imagine this may have happened to a number of us. You attend a high school or college reunion and someone unexpected shows up. In school this person was just a run-of-the-mill guy or gal, certainly not the person voted most likely to succeed. However, at the reunion, they turn out to be incredibly accomplished and perhaps even well-known. How could this be? Who could have predicted it? How do we make sense of it?

It seems this was the reaction of those in the synagogue in Nazareth when Jesus appears. And not only shows up, but proceeds to read the scripture, sit down and teach and most audaciously proclaim that he is the One foretold by the prophet Isaiah – the Messiah. You can imagine them saying to one another, "Isn't this Joseph and Mary's boy, the carpenter? Who is he to be making such outrageous claims? But if he is who he says he is, let him give us proof. Jesus, son of Joseph, show us a miracle like those they say you have performed elsewhere. Otherwise, you cannot be who you claim to be and there is no place for you here."

Does this resonate with us today? Are we in danger of becoming the contemporary Nazarenes? We claim to know Jesus. Some of us may have grown up with Him. One way or the other He may have become comfortably familiar to us. But have we really accepted Him for who he truly is, or are we just going through the motions? Have we really recognized Him as our Lord and Savior – the Messiah? Have we acted as he asked us and loved our neighbors as ourselves – the poor, the captive, the oppressed? Has our familiarity become too comfortable and blinded us to the profound and bold message Christ has proclaimed? He is the Son of God and through Him with God's grace we are saved from our sins and destined to be with Him forever. Let us always be mindful of this truth. Thanks be to God!
