### The World Turned Upside Down: Exploring the Gospel of Luke

In some ways, Luke is the most wellknown and beloved of the four Gospels. Only in Luke do we hear about shepherds at Christmas, the parables of the good Samaritan and the prodigal son, and the Easter story of the road to Emmaus. ### From the Pews, Blake Hoffman

I'd like to take a moment to offer an appreciation post on this Harbinger cover for the efforts of the Westminster Library. Over the past year, I have become more aware of just how richly blessed we are in this congregation. We have a wonderful staff, rigorous programming, and plentiful resources to support one's personal growth and discipleship. The time and discernment of volunteers and staff leadership provide our congregation with access to over 4,000 resources to satisfy our Presbyterian thirst for knowledge. It can be easy to take this robust collection, and those individuals behind-the-scenes, for granted.

As recommended by the Westminster library, I recently read theologian Debie Thomas', A Faith of Many Rooms: Inhabiting a More Spacious Christianity. Her writing explores a whole host of topics in a search for the Biblical faith large enough for our toughest questions and realities. I highly recommend this book to you all. Pastor Thomas' writing came to mind while reading today's scripture of Jesus and his disciples' rejection from the Samaritan village.

After all, how relatable is it that James and John sought comeuppance for a disrespect shown to them? Admittedly, perhaps calling fire down from heaven is a bit extreme. Our text shows just how much they need Jesus' guidance to temper their rage. I find that relatable to our recent past. I can also imagine that they would have benefitted from the writing of Pastor Thomas as she explains: "On our own, we have little capacity to discern what is good and right and holy and true." Like the disciples, we should not be so confident in our own judgement and actions, for when we think we can do it alone, we will be corrected by God.

I'll leave you with a passage of Debie Thomas' book that is inspiring me this week. In writing about Jacob's wrestling with God in Genesis 32, Pastor Thomas states: "This is no dainty, breakable God. This is a God of dust and sweat and blood and tears - a God who is willing to become dirty to lift us out of the dirt." Let us not forget that we belong to a God that is radical enough to rebuke us when we are wrong, to get dirty in order to claim us, and that loves us despite ourselves. Let us be claimed and led, and may this Lenten season be a blessing to you, and the love of God abound.
