# From the Pews, Mary Frances Knapp

Some of my fondest memories from high school years are those involving my youth group. Many of us went to different schools and had different friend groups, but our Sunday night crew became some of the people I felt most comfortable around. Ski trips to West Virginia and mission trips to Arizona and Canada remain some of the highlights of my teenage years. One of the most anticipated events occurred every summer when we got to attend Montreat's summer youth conference. (For our Westminster youth who will go this summer.... soak it up! I wish I could go back and do it again!)

One particular summer, the theme of the conference was "Come As you Are." The week was spent singing songs and meeting new faces. We were intentionally divided into small groups where we weren't with anyone from our hometown. Even though none of us knew each other, we quickly connected through shared stories and experiences. It didn't take long for us to realize that we were all much more alike than we were different. There was no judgment within the group. No one made fun or cast another's opinion aside. We connected with others and created a sense of belonging. What a gift that was to spend a week with people where you can truly, "Come as You Are." Why don't we all do that more often?

As I read Peter's story in Acts, I thought back to our weeks in Montreat. What I realize now is that we were doing more than just having fun and making friends. We were doing and spreading God's word. Peter tells us that God gives salvation to all, when you believe in him and do good by him. It doesn't matter your background, your status, or where you came from. We are all worthy of God's love. What good news that we can be just who we are, and God loves us all the same! In God's eyes, we are all invited and welcomed into his grace. We can never have enough reminders that we should "Come as we are." Peter reminds us to do as God would do. Love others like God loves us. Be yourself and let everyone else be themselves too. God embraces us all...just as we are.
