From the Pews, Mike Peters

Today's scripture comes from the book of Leviticus. In it God, through Moses, lays out in great detail how the Israelites should live when they enter the promised land. Chapter 19 has a litany of rules and regulations the Israelites are to follow. Some are paraphrases of the Ten Commandments; some are dietary requirements and health regulations; some describe rituals of sacrifice to the Lord; others describe consideration for the poor, weak, disabled and aged, others sexual mores, personal grooming, and even animal and plant husbandry. And finally, some on dealing with fellow Israelites and even foreigners.

In verses 33-34 the Lord says the following: "When a stranger sojourns with you in your land, you shall not do him wrong. The stranger who sojourns with you shall be to you as a native among you, and you shall love him as yourself, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt: I am the Lord your God."

Obviously, treatment of foreigners is an ongoing issue at the national level today. But this is a debate to which one can add little at this point. However, it is worth reflecting on the strangers among us in our local community and even in our church. Are we as welcoming as we could be to those who are foreign to us, perhaps not in nationality, but in race or lifestyle or other circumstances? Are we as welcoming as we could be to strangers who enter our sanctuary to worship with us or engage with us in some other way? Are we willing to make ourselves vulnerable and reach out to a seeming stranger in our pews? Let's admit it; we are all sojourners through this strange land called life. Let us embrace our fellow sojourners regardless of who they may be.
