From the Pews, Jaime Satterfield

Then the Lord said to Moses,

"I am going to rain bread from heaven for you,
and each day the people shall go out and gather enough for that day.

In that way I will test them,
whether they will follow my instruction or not.
On the sixth day, when they prepare what they bring in,
it will be twice as much as they gather on other days."

Just like how the Israelites found themselves in today's scripture passage, being a mom to three young children often feels like stepping into the wilderness with no map. Most days are full of needs — snacks to make, messes to clean, laundry to tend to, and the constant background noise of energy and emotions. There are moments I feel like the Israelites grumbling, wondering how I'll find the strength for yet another long day. But just as God provided manna for the Israelites, he provides for me, too. Sometimes it comes as a burst of patience I didn't think I had, or as a child's laughter breaking the tension. Often it is simply a reminder that tomorrow's strength will come tomorrow.

What I love about this passage is that God didn't give the Israelites a week's worth of manna to stockpile; He gave them enough for that day. Motherhood works the same way. I often want to figure out how I'll manage the week, or even the month ahead, but God gently teaches me to focus on today. He reminds me that he is present in the small, ordinary moments — when I'm rocking a child to sleep, folding tiny clothes, or answering a million questions before breakfast. Just like the Israelites learned to depend on God's daily provision, being a mom teaches me to trust that he is enough for me and my children, one day at a time.
