Sadly, recent events in our country emphasize the divisiveness of our society. In contrast, Jesus in John Chapter 4 Verses 7 - 15 ignores ethnic tensions and societal norms, offering instead dignity, respect and redemption to the Samaritan woman. What a profound "open mind, open heart" moment!

At Jacob's well in the community of Sychar, the woman is initially confused by her encounter with Jesus, unsure of his intent. We learn that this Samaritan woman has had five previous marriages and is living with a man who is not her husband. She approaches the well at midday alone, while most women visit as a group in the early morning. She is scorned by the community and her self-worth is reflected by her sad countenance. Regardless, Jesus breaks down this barrier of culture, gender and shame. He knows her past, yet he offers her a message of acceptance and hope.

Speaking openly with her, Jesus explains God's love, sharing that spiritual access is available to all, regardless of background. He invites her into the mystery of God's grace: "If you knew the gift of God... you would have asked Him, and he would have given you living water. Whoever drinks the water I give them," He said, "will never thirst." He reveals that by knowing God, she will receive the spiritual sustenance that leads to everlasting life.

As we gather for worship today, open your heart to receive this living water. Cognizant of our mistakes and shortcomings, we need to lay down our "jars" and be refreshed. Let us be transformed and drink deeply of his grace.
