From the Pews, Whit Walker

This week's scripture (Matthew 3:13-17) reveals to us one of the most sublime and significant events in Christian history. A poor itinerant minister, John the Baptist, is fulfilling his mission of baptizing his fellow Israelites, preaching repentance and seeking salvation with God. From a distance, a man approaches. John is both awed and intimidated. The man who approaches is the Messiah.

Imagine if you were John as Jesus asks you to baptize him. You're humbled and contrite, trying hard to decline the request. Yet Jesus is well aware of his destiny and persuades you to perform the deed. Then, as his baptism is completed, the gates of heaven open and the Holy Spirit descends as a dove alighting on Jesus' shoulder. A loud voice from the heavens confirms Jesus' identity by proclaiming, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." Seeing the Trinity together for the first time must have been an awesome spectacle for that long ago audience.

I also sense the same awe every time we baptize an infant in our church. I have to admit I occasionally get teary-eyed with emotion at the beauty and significance of this sacred event. My emotions begin at the opening prayer, continues with the charges asked of the parents and the congregation, and concludes with the minister walking the child down the center aisle, as our congregation sings "Baptized in Water." As an added bonus, we get to see some of the biggest smiles and proudest faces on the parents and family of the baptized child. Always something truly beautiful to behold.

Starting with his simple anointment in the river Jordan, Jesus devoted his life to helping us understand what a successful Christian life entails. Each time we reenact that event from two thousand years ago, I fervently pray that we can fulfill the vows we make to those newly baptized. Life is not always easy. Can we keep our faith and willpower strong enough to renounce sin and live the life Christ wants us to? Can we consistently set aside our personal issues to help those experiencing life's misfortunes? Are we the disciples Christ wants us to be, spreading the good news of the gospel? These are the promises we make to God - and to these infants and their families - just as Jesus did in his sacrament of baptism.
