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From the Pews, Jaime Satterfield

In today’s scripture reading, Matthew 5:13–16 calls believers to be “the salt of the earth” and “the light of the world.” These images feel especially relevant when raising children in today’s loud and sometimes confusing culture. Salt preserves and adds flavor, and, in the same way, parents are called to help preserve truth, character, and faith in their children’s hearts. In a world that constantly shifts its values, children need steady guidance and clear examples of kindness, integrity, and love. When parents live out these values consistently, they help their children develop a moral foundation that doesn’t depend on trends, peer pressure, or social media approval.

Jesus’ call to let our light shine is also a reminder that faith is meant to be visible, not hidden. This message resonates deeply with me as I remind myself to shine a light on my faith so that others can see Christ through me. My husband, Brad, and I practice this at home through prayer, forgiveness, and service, so that our kids learn that following Christ is not just something we say, but something we live. In a world filled with fear, division, and noise, children who are taught to reflect Christ’s light can become sources of hope, clarity, and peace and point others toward God.

This calling is reinforced by the Golden Rule found later in the same chapter: “So in everything, do to others what you would have them do to you.” As I grow older, I realize this teaching isn’t just for our children. Treating others with empathy, respect, and compassion is something we are all called to embody as followers of Christ. When parents model this way of living, children learn that shining God’s light often begins with simple, everyday choices to love others well. I would even argue that when we treat other adults this way, it leaves a lasting impression and is how others experience Christ through us. I cannot imagine a more pertinent time where we should all be exercising the Golden Rule with our neighbors across all communities, as we try our best to glorify God in our everyday lives.
