Traditionally, the Fourth Sunday of Advent is the day on which we focus on God's LOVE. But *this* December with Advent 4 and Christmas Eve bumping right up against one another, I'm placed in the mindset of "almost, but not quite yet!" In fact, if I'm honest, as I read the news from across the globe, my mindset is more like, "How long, O Lord? Will your promise of the Peaceful Kingdom ever be realized for even the least of your children? Or will we forever be squinting our eyes at the horizon, struggling to keep faith in a world filled with such discord and suffering?"

In such a world, it is easy to lose heart. But at this time of year, a Service of Lessons and Carols can remind us that we are not alone in our journey of faith. The marriage of word and music, texts and tradition, and carols both old and new can strengthen us while we await God's inbreaking presence.

As we journey through today's service, we make our way from the "lowly cattle shed" to the promise that the Christ child, "weak in infancy" will lead us to "peace eternal." Along the way, we will encounter starkly contrasting images – the ringing bells of heaven with the grief of the lonely exile; the love of a mother who rocks her child born into a weary land; the magnificence of an angelic chorus and the murderous deeds of a raging king. Such are the contrasts of the story; such are the contrasts within our own lives.

Traveling together, I invite you to reflect upon your own journey. For what do you long? For what do you rejoice? For what do you wait? For what measure of justice are you praying and working? And throughout I invite you to SING! Join your voice **boldly** here in this place – with your neighbors in the pews, with the choir, with the instruments – knowing that even as we wait for God's reign to break forth, in our togetherness we are not alone.

Then as we come to the close of today's journey, perhaps we will recall the words of the opening carol when we sang, "and our eyes at last shall see him." And when we do, may we realize that throughout our "tears and smiles" God, in Jesus and through the Spirit, has been with us all along the way. Amen.

About the Service of Lessons & Carols

The Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols was first held on Christmas Eve 1918 at King's College, Cambridge. It was planned by Eric Milner-White, who, at the age of thirty-four, had just been appointed Dean of King's after experience as an army chaplain which had convinced him that the Church of England needed more imaginative worship.

A revision of the Order of Service was made in 1919 involving rearrangement of the lessons. From that date the service has always begun with the hymn 'Once in Royal David's City.' In almost every year the choice of carols has varied, and some new ones have been introduced. The backbone of the service, the lessons and the prayers, has remained virtually unchanged. The original service was, in fact, adapted from an order drawn up by E. W. Benson, later Archbishop of Canterbury, for use in the wooden shed, which then served as his cathedral in Truro, at 10 p.m. on Christmas Eve 1880.

The service is held during the Advent and Christmas season throughout the world, from the East Indies to the British Isles and Greenville, South Carolina. In 2023 we celebrate its 63rd year as a centerpiece of the life and worship of Westminster.

Wherever the service is heard and however it is adapted, whether the music is provided by choir or congregation, the pattern and strength of the service, as Dean Milner-White pointed out, derive from the lessons and not the music. 'The main theme is the development of the loving purposes of God [seen] through the windows and the words of the Bible.' Many of those who took part in the first service must have recalled those killed in the Great War when it came to the famous passage 'all those who rejoice with us, but on another shore and in a greater light.' The center of the service is still found by those who 'go in heart and mind' and who consent to follow where the story leads.
