As the holiday season comes to a close, the crowds at the mall subside, and the onslaught of Amazon packages wain, it is in the remaining few days of a slower pace with my family that I truly grasp the extent of this week's scripture. Having searched over the holidays for multiple examples to share with our children on the importance of properly placed values versus the empty promises of brand name commercialism, I had only to look here to find the one lesson I really needed.

In Isaiah 60:1-6, Isaiah reminds all those of Jerusalem to *"Let your light shine for all to see. For the glory of the Lord rises to shine on you. Look and see, for everyone is coming home! Your sons are coming from distant lands: your little daughters will be carried home. Your eyes will shine, and your heart will thrill with joy!"*

And in Matthew 2:1-12 *"When they saw the star, they were filled with joy! They entered the house and saw the child with his mother, Mary, and bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasure chest and gave him gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh."*

In reading, both of these verses I took away two key lessons that took me well into my late 40's to truly grasp.

First, it is of family, friends and relationships that true happiness and the gifts of love, sacrifice and respect can be found — and second, that it is ONLY on God's time, plan and His hand that we have what we need in our lives when we need it. Not by our control or wish.

In the warm company of my in-laws, brother and sister-in-law, new wife and step kids do I finally realize what I have so longingly desired (previously in all the wrong places and all the wrong people) can only now be fulfilled on God's terms.

I believe the scripture is telling me to appreciate not some self or socially appointed promise or prophesy that guarantees marriage, family, joy, happiness but the opportunity to see the blessing he has meant for us on his terms not ours. BUT ONLY when we have the right eyes to see the light he has set for us to follow.

I realized all the while I was trying to enlighten my kids with examples of the true gift of Christmas and that (while hard to say as a parent) until they have experienced disappointment, made mistakes, and had some level of failure, would they truly gain the insight of humility, empathy, respect and gratitude to be open to receiving God's greatest gift. His sacrifice for us.

It took failed and expensive school choices, a broken marriage and poor vetting of past business partners to realize the true value, character and relationships I really needed to appreciate. Money, pride, ownership, accolades and social norms were all things of misaligned priorities in my prior life and only when I was prepared to walk away from them all did God put the right choices in my path.

As I sit here this first Sunday of 2018 surrounded by family and friends and blessed by gifts I could have never imaged, I thank God for the path he's laid before me, in spite of me.

ADULT EDUCATION OPPORTUNITIES

“If a person is in Christ, she is a new creation, the past is finished and done, behold the new has come” (II Cor. 5:17). Not only is the New Year upon us, but so is the possibility to live a new life in Jesus. Come worship, stretch, grow, be mentally and spiritually challenged, laugh, and share with other church members in worship services and adult Sunday School in 2018.

At Westminster, in adult Sunday School, we offer courses on the Bible, theology, social issues, and relationships in a rotation model. Class options change every 6-8 weeks so that members can learn about and discuss our Christian faith and all of its implications. With this model, people of all ages, genders, opinions, and interests are constantly rearranging and getting to know each other. Join us in this vibrant style of Christian adult education.

The following classes will be offered on Sundays, from **10-11:00 a.m.**, starting **January 7** and ending **February 25**.

1. Being Mortal: Medicine and What Matters in the End

Medicine has triumphed in modern times, transforming the dangers of childbirth, injury, and disease from harrowing to manageable. But when it comes to the human realities of aging, frailty, and death, what medicine can do often runs counter to what it should do. As Christians, and creatures made by God, how do we protect meaning, purpose, and grace as we age and die, in the face of the temptation to keep medically treating our bodies. Using a book by Atul Gawande, MD, this class will wrestle with these hard questions.

2. Faith in God in a Scientific Age

This course will probe the tension some feel between their religious beliefs and modern science. The class will look at our understanding of God; ways of knowing in religion and in science, specific challenges to religion raised by science, and whether science makes belief in God “obsolete.”

3. Fierce Women of the Bible and Their Stories of Violence, Mercy, Bravery, Wisdom, Sex, and Salvation

The word for the year 2017 was “feminism” due to the increasing attention on the roles, treatment, and status of women in the modern world. But the issue of how women have been treated, mistreated, and represented is an old, old story; one that shows up frequently in the pages of the Old and New Testaments of our Bible. This class will review some of the known and unknown stories of women in the Bible — from Tamar, Asherah, Deborah, the Marys, and Rhoda — and ask what their stories can teach us as we attempt to honor God and follow Christ.

4. Good News: The Gospel. Faux News: What’s New? Ethics in Journalism

With a delayed start on **January 14**, this discussion class will look at the news. Ethical journalism strives to ensure the free exchange of information that is accurate, fair and thorough, all the while being done with integrity. Are we in danger of losing this? The Gospel, on the other hand, is to give us information so that we can have faith in Jesus Christ, the very Word of God, and live a life of discipleship. Are we in danger of losing this, too? How do Christians discern and evaluate what is honest, valid and life changing in all the news (religious and secular) that we are bombarded with?

5. The Text This Week
